Questions where we are offering or asking for something.

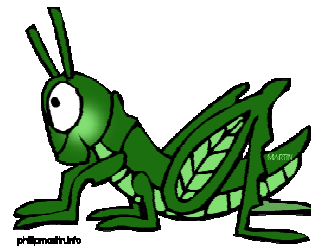
We use **any** in:
